Why study in the USA?

More than 10,000 students from the UK study in the United States every year. Find out why so many students choose the US for their studies.

Quality, variety and reputation of US universities

Although university rankings should be taken with a grain of salt, US institutions consistently rank in the top ten universities in the Times Higher Education World University Rankings.

With over 4,000 institutions offering undergraduate degrees, students can also choose from a large and diverse pool of universities, compared to 120 universities in the UK. From such variety of universities, there's bound to be one that's a great fit for you.

Liberal arts curriculum and focus on teaching

You don't have to know what you want to study when you start your degree. The liberal arts curriculum at US universities is a real selling point for students who don't want to narrow their study options at the age of 18.

A liberal arts education allows students to become well-rounded and provides them with flexibility in exploring their academic interests before specialising in a major, or even a double major. If you have a passion for something and it is not offered, you might even be able to create your own curriculum and degree.

Campus life and extracurricular activities

Whereas UK universities focus on independent learning and particularly on academics, on a US campus, your learning and development is encouraged outside of the classroom/library too.

American universities aim to educate the whole student by providing opportunities for extracurricular involvement, community service, internships, sport, leadership and the arts. If there isn't a club you're interested in, you can create your own.

Funding opportunities

The availability of funding is a big draw for international students. Undergraduate scholarships are often offered to students based on merit, extracurricular achievement, financial need or certain personal characteristics. Just being an international student makes you stand out, so if you look hard and remain flexible, there's probably a scholarship for you.

Internationalise your CV

Employers are increasingly looking for graduates with international experience and broad skill sets.

International students in the US also have the opportunity to gain work experience during their studies through work experience and internships and can work in the US for up to one year after graduation from an American university on the Optional Practical Training (OPT) scheme; graduates in STEM subjects can stay on for up to three years.

Application timeline

Ideally, the process of applying for will begin $1-1\frac{1}{2}$ years before enrolment at a US university. For most students, this is during the spring/summer at the end of Year 12 (or equivalent).



Spring/early summer at the end of Year 12:

- Begin by reading the comprehensive US admissions information provided in the 'EducationUSA Advice' section of the Fulbright website: **www.fulbright.org.uk** and begin thinking about your choosing factors.
- Research universities that meet your criteria and begin selecting the universities to which you will apply.
- Make a schedule of application deadlines and requirements.
- Based on the universities you are interested in, decide whether you need to take an admissions exam (the ACT or SAT) and register early. See page 16 for more info on admissions tests.
- Begin drafting your university and funding applications.
- Most university applications open online on 1 August, including the Common Application (used by over 900 US universities).

Autumn/early winter of Year 13:

- If you need to submit standardised test scores for your applications and have not already taken the test, you should register for and sit it at this point. The tests are offered on specific dates, generally from October through June. Depending on the test, it can take a few weeks for your scores to be ready. Keep in mind, most universities would like to receive these scores in time for their application deadlines and you will want to see them before they go to the universities, so you can act accordingly.
- Narrow your choices to the final list of universities to which you will apply. We recommend applying to 6-10 well-chosen universities (see page 10 for factors to consider when choosing a university).
- Write and edit your admissions essays.
- Request a transcript from your school and choose referees for 2-3 letters of recommendation.
- Alongside (or as part of) your admissions applications, apply for funding from US universities and external funding bodies – see page 12 for more information on funding US study.
- **Submit your applications.** Early Decision (legally binding) and Early Action deadlines are generally in early November, while Regular admissions deadlines tend to be in January.

Spring/summer of Year 13:

- Receive regular admissions decisions by email or post between March and April.
- Notify the universities of your decision by 1 May, pay a non-refundable deposit and apply for your visa.
- August/early September: orientation and enrolment - begin study in the US!

Choosing a university

With thousands of academic programmes, world-class institutions and unrivalled flexibility, the USA offers a breadth of higher education opportunities you won't find anywhere else in the world.

Narrowing these institutions down can be an exciting and surprising process, and many students find their perfect match at a university or location they had not previously thought or maybe even heard of. To help you narrow down the many options of universities in the US, we have created three steps to find your fit. Follow our three-step process for choosing the best university for you!

Step 1: Think before you search

Speak to those closest to you and prioritise the more important factors for your US university experience. The list below is not exhaustive, but lays out some things you might consider:

- Type of degree and university, class size
- Funding opportunities, cost of living
- Academics (whether you're on par with their average admitted student, majors on offer, style of teaching etc)
- Personal fit (campus life, size, setting, clubs, internship opportunities etc)

Step 2: Do your research

Once you know what is important to you, it's time to do some research and put together a list of 10-20 universities that meet all or most of your criteria.

Please see our website for several links with resources that can help aid your research process, including our own USA College Day university page and other university search engines and review guides.

Some of these resources include university rankings, but rankings in the USA are not the same as in the UK. Some do not rate the quality of teaching or graduate prospects, and some give weight to how much money a university has, or even invite universities to peer rank themselves! We therefore advise that you take rankings with a grain of salt.

While rankings can be a useful tool, they should not be the only method you use to choose a university. We encourage you to use the search functions listed on our website to look for universities that meet the factors that are important to you.

Step 3: Narrow your choices

Once you have 10-20 universities that meet your criteria, you should narrow this list down to the ones to which you will apply to and which will be the best fit for you. Think strategically to increase your chances of admission.

We recommend you apply to 6-10 US universities to maximise your competitiveness, with a range of institutions including:

- 2-3 "reach schools" schools where admission would be tough based on your academic profile
- 2-4 "match schools" schools that match your academic profile
- 2-3 "likely admittance schools" schools where your academic profile is safely higher than their average (think 'insurance' choice)

If you require university funding, consider applying to more 'insurance' choice and match schools than reach institutions. Wherever your academic profile is higher than the university's average, the more likely it is that you will be a competitive applicant and stand a greater chance of gaining merit-based scholarships if there are any available.





Campus visits

You do not need to visit a US university before you apply. However, if you have the resources and time to do so, campuses are usually open for self-guided tours throughout the year, except federal holidays and winter closures. You should contact each university to find out their specific arrangements, and when guided tours are available.

If you cannot visit a university, consider the following:

- Meet the university at USA College Day
- Check if virtual tours are available
- Ask the admissions office to put you in touch with a British student or alumnus
- Follow the university on social media

Funding US study

There are lots of opportunities to fund your undergraduate studies in the USA, but strategy and organisation are key.

What to know:

- Universities with higher "sticker prices" can sometimes also be the ones with large endowments to fund the most competitive applicants
- It pays to be flexible and open-minded
- You can't take your UK student loan with you
- Not all US universities offer financial aid to international students

Steps for funding US study:

1. Visit the Undergraduate Study – Funding section of the Fulbright website (**www.fulbright.org.uk**) for information about funding US study. Funding options include: Personal/family savings, scholarships from US universities, scholarships from external funding bodies and loans from a US or UK lender.

2. Assess your personal/family savings to determine your financial need.

3. Investigate university funding. Applying for funding often happens simultaneous to (or is integrated into) the admissions process. US universities may award funding on the basis of financial need (sometimes referred to as grants) and/or merit (scholarships), as well as sports scholarships.

4. Choose your US universities carefully, as not all will offer funding to international students. Some may have significant financial aid, scholarships or be located in areas with lower living costs (see page 10 for more tips on choosing a university).

5. Explore external scholarships. Many scholarships from external funding bodies are awarded based on specific personal qualities outlined by the funding body. Enjoy doing volunteer work on the weekend, have a unique background or participate in community theatre? There may well be an organisation or university that is willing to reward you for who you are and what you like to do. Scholarships from external funding bodies may also be awarded on the basis of merit.

6. Loans. The availability of US-based loans for non-US citizens is limited. In almost all cases, US-based loan programmes require non-US citizens to have a creditworthy US citizen or permanent resident to act as a co-signer. UK citizens may apply for a personal loan from a UK bank and apply it toward US study, however you should pay careful attention to the terms and conditions of such loans. US citizens can apply for US government loans via the FAFSA website and may be eligible for loans from a private US-based lender.

Funding tips:

- Talk to each university you're interested in about money - they might be able to give much more direct answers than the website
- Be strategic in choosing where to apply and during which admissions round
- Start your scholarship search early and be willing to put in extra time and effort to seek out and apply for scholarships
- Apply to multiple sources of funding (including university and external funding bodies)
- Keep in mind that if you are not a US citizen, you will need to demonstrate access to sufficient funding for the first year of study in order to apply for a visa

The application process

We recommend that you begin this process early! You should plan adequately for the time and effort involved. We also advise you to stay organised and note deadlines to track what you need to do and when.

Start early, plan ahead, and know the application requirements.

Be aware that applications require a great deal of preparation and planning. In the US, application requirements can vary greatly from one institution to another, so you will need to check the website of each institution's international admissions office. Undergraduate applications are typically due between November and January to enrol the following autumn.

Things to know:

- Unlike UCAS, you apply to each US university separately
- Over 900 US institutions use the Common Application, an online portal to help you manage each application – we have a page dedicated to this on our website with a student and school guide, as well as video tutorials
- Universities will set their own application deadlines, fees and requirements
- You apply to the university, college or school as an undergraduate student, not to a specific degree programme or department
- Offers of admission are not conditional/ unconditional in the way that most UK offers are – if they admit you, they expect you to continue working towards your predicted grades, but won't specify required grades and are unlikely to rescind your offer unless your final results are significantly lower than your predictions

Since US university applications are slightly longer than in the UK, you have a greater opportunity to demonstrate why you are a suitable applicant. The US admissions process is holistic and your application is taken in context.

If you've done your research and have chosen suitable universities, you stand every chance of being an attractive applicant to the admissions committee. More British students study in the USA than anywhere else in the world: we want to study there, and they want us on their campuses. The following components typically make up a university application: **1. Application form:** which asks for basic information such as contact details, schools attended, marks achieved, work experience, community/school-related activities, etc.

2. Transcript and school report: a transcript is a listing of your academic qualifications and marks covering your final four years at secondary school/sixth form. It may include GCSE marks, predicted A-levels (or equivalent), academic honours, information about your school, etc. Your school/counsellor may need to create a transcript – we have a template and further guidance on transcripts available on our website. The school report provides the admissions committee with information about the context in which you have studied.

3. Admissions test scores: admissions test scores (either the ACT or SAT) will be sent to universities that require them by the organisation that administered the test.

4. Essays: strong essays can set you apart from other applicants and give you an opportunity to showcase what you as an individual can bring to a university. Rather than submitting an explanation of your interests and achievements in a specific field of study as you would in your UCAS personal statement, you will be asked to respond to between one and three essay questions on your US university application. Each university will set its own questions, as well as desired length for your response (often 250-650 words).

5. Recommendation letters: you will likely be required to gather 2-3 letters of recommendation from people who know you well in and out of the classroom. The university may provide guidelines for selecting referees, such as requiring one letter from a teacher or school official. You will be responsible for liaising with your referee and should use recommendation letters as a marketing tool for you as an applicant. We have further guidance on this component of your application in the university guide on our website.

6. Application fee: you should also be aware that there may be a fee involved for each university application



you submit, which is set by each institution. This is another reason we advise you to narrow down your options to 6-10 universities! You should anticipate approximately \$50-100 per application, though fee waivers may be available in some cases.

We have a detailed guide to US undergraduate applications available on our website at **www.fulbright.org.uk**, where you can find substantial information to learn about the different application components. We go into each requirement in detail, discuss how admissions decisions are made, and give guidance on what you should be doing during the year to apply effectively.

Admissions tests: ACT & SAT

Admissions exams are a way for some universities to compare applicants who might come from different backgrounds and educational systems across the USA and the world.

Results are used to support part of a university's admissions and merit-based scholarship decisions.

They can assess, among other things:

- Verbal reasoning and language analysis
- Critical reading
- Writing
- Mathematics and data analysis

Are they required?

Universities can set their own admission requirements. Many will require the submission of admissions exam scores. However, an increasing number of universities are becoming *test optional*. This means they will not hold it against applicants who do not submit scores. In lieu of a test score, a test optional institution might require you to submit a graded piece of coursework or controlled assessment. A full list of test optional institutions can be found on **www.fairtest.org**, but doublecheck with the institutions where you're applying to see if you need to take a test.

Which exam to take?

There are two undergraduate admissions exam formats accepted by US universities:

- ACT administered by ACT, Inc
- SAT administered by The College Board

There are online resources comparing the two tests side by side, and we have linked the *Princeton Review table* on our website as a tool to help determine which test is the best for you.

Universities do not prefer one test over the other, so which one you take is down to your personal preference. You can take free sample tests on each exam's website and should play to your strengths.

Prepare properly for whichever exam you decide to take. There are many free resources available online, including practice-tests and resources provided by both ACT, Inc. and The College Board for their respective exams.

Test centre locations

Location and availability might determine which test you take as the SAT and ACT offer tests at varying points in the year as well as different test-taking centres. We have links on our website with the details related to testing centre locations and times.






